

## **Articles of Faith**

- 1. There is but One living and true God, the great Creator, and there are three Persons in the Godhead: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost. Genesis 1:1-27; Matthew 28:19; 1st John 5:7.
- We believe the Holy Bible to be the inspired Word of God. 2nd Timothy 3:16; 2nd Peter 1:20, 21.
- 3. We believe we are justified when we repent of our sins and believe in Jesus Christ. Mark 1:15; Acts 13:38-39; Romans 5:1.
- 4. We believe Sanctification to be a definite work of grace subsequent to Salvation. St. John 15:2, 17:16, 17; Ephesians 5:25-27; 1st John 1:9.
- 5. We believe in the Baptism with the Holy Ghost, and speaking in other tongues as the Spirit gives utterance to be the initiatory evidence of this experience. Acts 2:4, 19:6, 10:44-46. Since the Spirit gives the utterance when one is baptized with the Holy Ghost, we reject the teaching that one who has received the Baptism of the Holy Ghost can speak in tongues at will, without the Spirit prompting the utterance.
- 6. We believe in divine healing for the body. Acts 3:2-12, 9:32-43, 5:15, 16; James 5:14. We do not condemn medical science.
- 7. We believe every gift we receive from God, including divine healing, comes through the merits of the atonement. Romans 5:11; James 1:16-17.
- 8. We believe in the operation of the nine Gifts of the Spirit. We also believe in the manifestation of the nine Fruit of the Spirit and recognize that these should be present in the life of every believer. 1st Corinthians 12:1-12; Galatians 5:22-23.
- 9. We believe in the imminent rapture of the church, and the personal, pre-millennial Second Coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. Acts 1:10, 11; 1st Thessalonians 4:13-18; Revelation 1:7.
- 10. We, as a church, believe in the eternal redemption of all saints who are faithful to the end. Matthew 24:13; Revelation 2:10. We reject the theory of "once in grace always in grace" regardless of conduct. 1st Corinthians 10:12; Galatians 5:4.
- 11. We believe all who die out of Christ will be punished eternally, but those who die in Him shall share in His glory forever. Daniel 12:2; Matthew 24:46; St. John 5:29; Jude 7.
- 12. We believe the Bride of Christ is composed of the entire spiritual church. 1st Corinthians 12:25; 2nd Corinthians 11:2; Galatians 3:28, 29; Ephesians 4:16, 5:23-33; Revelation 19:7, 8.
- 13. We believe in the sacredness of marriage between one man and one woman. We promote commitment to strong family values. Ephesians 5:31-33, 6:1-4; Hebrews 13:4; Matthew 19:5; Leviticus 18:22; Genesis 2:24
- 14. We require all our ministers to speak the same thing and that there be no division among us in doctrine concerning our Articles of Faith. 1st Corinthians 1:10.



### Stanza:

Before I could read I probably knew the lyrics and was singing "What a Friend We Have in Jesus." I had heard Brother Elton Marchant lead our church in this song countless times and thus knew it by heart. As Christians, we do come to understand the reality that we indeed have an amazing faithful friend in Jesus. While we were yet sinners He loved and gave Himself for us, forgiving us, and washing our sins away. He knows our thoughts and weaknesses yet cares deeply about our lives. As this truth is beyond amazing, there is a line in this great hymn by Joseph Scriven that grabs my attention:

"What a privilege to carry everything to God in prayer."

What an incredible privilege! Can you even grasp the fact that the God of the Heavens and the Earth listens to us? He invites us to petition Him with our every concern. He's not put off by our many requests regarding our struggles or sadness, fears, and feelings, or trials and tribulations. The Apostle Paul said in Philippians 4:6-7, "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus." This privilege of peace gained through prayer is based solely upon a relationship with God through Christ Jesus.

There have been numerous people in my life that have been good mentors for me when it comes to prayer. Yet, no one left a more indelible mark on me regarding prayer than Harold "Uncle Dud" Cook. "Uncle Dud" played a left-handed Martin guitar in our church. He also played the harmonica and would sing specials. You would rarely find him far away from his guitar. He would bring it out at men's meetings, workdays, or whenever he could find a good time to pick and grin. However, It was more than the playing, he was looking

for a time to worship and praise his Mighty God. That's not all...he would shout and rejoice in the Lord. As I'm thinking about him now, I can almost hear his familiar voice praising and magnifying the Lord.

"Uncle Dud" was so faithful. He seemed to never miss church for any reason. I've heard him call our church, "home." Not "home church" but "Home." The reason he called our local church "home" was that he was there more than he was at home. There was a place behind our church in a "pine thicket," as the old-timers would say. All of us church kids knew it as the grounds where the church adults would go pray, particularly the men. There were seasons in the life of the church where numerous men and women would gather there for prayer. However, there was only one day that "Uncle Dud" would go pray and that was every day, every week, every month of every season, of every year.

It didn't even matter what the weather was like. As a kid and teenager living in the church parsonage, I would see him there in heat or cold, rain or shine. I countless times would sneak up to the edge of the pine thicket and hear him talking to God. Sometimes he would

play his guitar and sing, and on occasion, someone would join him. Alone or with others didn't seem to matter to him. He was not there for them.

The reality for "Uncle Dud" was that he had a friend in Jesus who bore all his sins and grief. He daily took advantage of the privilege to carry everything to God-his Friend in prayer. He was the most praying man ever and he would stay there for what seemed like hours. I so wish all of you could have known him. "Uncle Dud" was the happiest man I've ever met. Yet as an adult

I found out that life was difficult for him on many fronts, but you never would know it by the way he rejoiced and glowed with a positive attitude.

I pray that you and I will follow "Uncle Dud's" example daily. Let us not just remember his daily encounters with God. May we regularly have our own experience with our God. What A Friend We Have in Jesus!

### CONVERSION

I was 13 years old, when I accepted Christ as my Lord and Savior. It went like this: CHC arrived in my city, Fortaleza, on September 7, 1980, settling in close to my parents' house.

Being from a Catholic family, but without ever going to a Catholic church, I didn't know anything about God and Jesus Christ, heaven, hell, so I started attending the services at the pastor's house, which were mostly children and, in October 9, a month later, I answered a call at the altar and went to confess Jesus Christ as my Lord and Savior. I was the first in my parents' home to become an evangelical Christian. When I came home that night and told my Catholic mother, she started to lecture me and say: now you can no longer play soccer, you can no longer watch television, you can no longer go to the beach, you can no longer play with your colleagues, and you can't do this, you can't do that other, it was a tough sermon. I went to sleep thinking about many things. I was a normal 13 year old teenager who enjoyed playing with my classmates. I woke up the next day I went to school and

when I got home I left the school books and ran to the pastor's house and the first thing I saw was the pastor's kids playing soccer, I was so happy and I said to myself: my mom do not know nothing, she is not evangelical. I stood firm in the church, I didn't miss a service. I was desperately reading the Bible, first

a new testament I had won, then the complete Bible I had also received as a gift. By the age of 15, with two years of faith, I had already read the New Testament five times and the complete Bible three times. My mom said I was going to be crazy about reading the Bible so much.

### **INTIMACY WITH CHRIST**

I've always been a great friend of Jesus, since my conversion, talking to him has always been part of my life, I don't speak only when I'm in a prayer posture, I don't like that term, I talk to him walking and driving, working, doing anything, when I go to sleep, I am wrapped in the sheet and mentally I am talking until I sleep, this practice comes from my adolescence and I practice until today. I have two children, Priscila, a psychologist and Miqueias, an airplane pilot. Miqueias was born with a serious bile duct problem, with a few days of birth we took him to the doctor because something was not normal, tests were done and the doctors said he would live only two years if he did not have surgery, rare at that time, but did not guarantee that he got over this surgery. He

was two months old when they opened it in half, he still has the scar. His mother, Gedalva, and I prayed that God's will would be done. I said: Jesus, my friend, if you're going to take it now, you shouldn't have given it. Well, it's yours, if you don't want me to take care of it, your will is done. When they went to operate, they said that if the surgery was successful and he resisted, he would live until 12 years old. We forgot what the doctors said, today Miqueias is 27 years old and has more health than his parents. Jesus is my greatest friend ever.

### CALL TO THE PASTORAL MINISTRY

My spiritual relationship with Jesus was always in a growing process of responsibility, at the age of 15 I was already teaching in the youth class at Sunday School, I had the opportunity to preach in camp services in the squares and on the streets, I attracted a lot of young people to hear the gospel, I gained a lot friends for Jesus. I won my whole family too, my parents and my brothers. I have always been obedient to my pastors and they have started to put responsibility on me in positions within departments in the church. I was secretary, treasurer, teacher and youth president. At the age of 16 I was consecrated to a missionary worker, at the age of 17 to a licensed preacher. I was my pastor's right-hand man, I did everything in the church. I was also secretary and treasurer for the local church. My pastor had a degenerative disease in the bones and nerves and could not stand for a long time, I was his favorite preacher. Once, the Director of World Missions of the CHC, Rev L.M. Reese came to Fortaleza and my pastor asked him to consecrate me as assistant pastor. L. M. Reese thought I was very young, but after my pastor spoke about me, then he decided to consecrate me. Three years later, I became pastor of the only CHC church in Fortaleza. Two years later, in 1990, at a national church conference in Manaus-AM, I was elected national treasurer on the national committee, and I remained in that position for 9 years until 1997. That year I was elected national superintendent and I still serve today. During my pastoral life I did not stop studying, I completed my studies, I entered college and I graduated in full degree in Sciences of Religion, I did a second college, Bachelor of Theology, I did a master's degree in Missions, and I also received the title "honoris causa" of Doctor of Divinity by the Panamerican Theological Seminary.

## GROWTH OF THE CHURCH – FORTALEZA-BRAZIL.

God's plan for my life was unfolding mainly in my city and state, with only one existing church, we started to start new churches as I prepared leaders. One by one they were open, small churches, but with strong leadership. Today in my state of Ceará we have fifty and one churches established with pastors. Until 2006 the State of Amazonas had the largest number of churches, today the State of Ceará has the highest concentration of CHC churches.

The CHC are present in 12 States of Brazil. We now have over 180 temples built, not included the work of family groups, cells, houses of worship and preaching points, missions that we come to adding about 400. About 100 temples are in two States of Brazil; State of Ceará, where I live, and Amazonas State, where it started the church. We have two rehabilitation centers for drug addicts . One in Fortaleza and another in Boa Vista, Roraima. In Roraima we are the second largest center for drug treatment in the State. Currently the church advances occupying space in the regions of the North, Northeast, Midwest, Southeast and South of the country.

## LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE FORTALEZA – BRAZIL AND THE SKELTONS

Once a year a Conference is held in Fortaleza, always in the month of December. It is a Leadership Conference, where approximately

400 leaders gather in the capital. They are pastors, presbyteries, evangelists, mission workers, deacons, and various leaders who serve in local churches. For many years the Rev. Hugh Skelton and Allen Skelton have come uninterruptedly attending this conference and with them come other american pastors. Pr. Scotty Poole has a great heart for world missions and has attended this conference for many consecutive years. Every year new workers are consecrated, pastors, presbyteries, evangelists, mission workers and deacons. All these leaders have preparation classes in the CHC headquarter in Fortaleza.

### **CHC IN SOUTH AMERICA**

In South America we are in Brazil, Argentina, Chile, Bolivia, Paraguay, Venezuela, British Guiana, Colombia and Aruba (Caribbean). We already had a mission in Uruguay and Ecuador, today there is no more.

In March 2011 I were nominated for Continental Representative for South America to help the World Mission Director.

As a Continental Representative I have already held two major conferences for South American countries, one in Manaus-Brazil and the other in Aruba. A third was scheduled for early 2020 in Chile, but it was not possible due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

# REMEMBERING REVEREND JAMES MICHAEL SPENCE 1954-2021

ood people die every day. Yet not all of them affirm for us the goodness in humanity and leadership the way James Michael Spence did. He left a legacy of positive experiences for anyone who took the time to know him. It was my distinguished privilege to meet Brother Mike Spence several years ago. I was honored to have served as his assistant for the last eight years on the North Georgia District Presbytery. His demeanor was one of profound respect. He was eager to work and willing to do whatever was needed to get the job accomplished.

Mike was a graduate of Emmanuel College. He served as the Hickory Pentecostal Holiness Church pastor, The Mt. Holly Pentecostal Holiness Church pastor, The North Wilkesboro Pentecostal Holiness Church pastor, and The Bethel Pentecostal Holiness Church pastor before coming to our denomination. He served our denomination with distinction. He was the Pastor of the Shawsville Congregational Holiness Church in Shawsville, Virginia, and the District Superintendent of the Virginia District.

Brother Mike transferred to the North Ga District of the Congregational Holiness Church in 2006, from the Virginia District to pastor The New Hope Worship Center in Danielsville, Georgia. He served on the district Presbytery as First Assistant Superintendent for eight years. After more than thirty-nine years of ministering the word in youth camps, camp meetings, revivals, conferences, seminars, retreats, homecomings, hospitals, prison facilities, radio broadcast, on world mission fields, and more, along with serving in many leadership positions on the local and District levels, in 2013, Brother Mike was elected to the highest rank of the North Georgia District of the Congregational Holiness Church, which is District Superintendent. He served as District Superintendent for almost eight years. Brother Mike entered the ministry at age sixteen and preached the gospel for forty-seven years.

He brought insightful leadership to our District. He set the bar for excellence and improvements to our District and The Union Grove Campground. Mike spearheaded several projects on the campground, making numerous improvements to several of our facilities, enhancing what was a special place to him and all of us.

Mike was known for mentoring others in the ministry he loved; he was the "go-to" person for young ministers to gain the self-confidence needed to do the ministry. He sought to develop the people who worked in our organization because he knew they would be better leaders because of what they learned.

Had he lived to serve another term, Brother Mike expressed his mission for the next four

years to stop doing all the things unimportant to the kingdom and focus on loving, restoring, and disciplining the ministers and ministry teams of the North Georgia District.

is, but it doesn't have to stay that way". His philosophy was if you do not like the way it is, change it.

The bottom line is he was a great leader. And when you pulled back the curtain of all that entails, you can also see that he was also a good person who cared about others. We can all learn a lot about leadership and humanity by following Mike's example.

Thank you, Mike, for setting an example we all can strive to emulate. Thank you for your never-ending dedication to our Church and those men and women you have faithfully served.

There is a way to pay tribute to Mike by following his example. Make a difference in someone's life today, and tomorrow make a difference in the life of someone new. I learned from Mike that it does not require a loud voice, a gavel, or a strong personality to be a leader. It takes a heart of passion and a commitment to challenging work. Do you want to help others? Then help others. Do you want to build something great? Then build something great. He taught me the best way to lead is to delegate, and the best way to influence is to listen.

I will miss my friend until we are reunited on the other side. Indeed, a great man a prince has fallen, but I know where he is, and I look forward to the day when we are together again.
